Winged Foot golfer in playoff for MGA Senior Championship

SYOSSET, L.I. — Mal Galleta of North Hills Country Club accomplished Thursday what most professional golfers can only dream about — shoot his age of 73 — but it was only good enough for a share of the lead of the 57th annual Metropolitan Golf Association Senior Championship.

Galleta, who carved 39-34-73 over the 6,245-yard, par 36-36-72 Woodcrest CC course, and Jim Maver of Winged Foot, who shot 37-36-73, will meet in an 18-hole playoff next Thursday to determine the champion.

Richard Remsen of Meadowbrook was alone in third place with 37-37-74, while Mike Matwell of Glen Cove fol-

lowed with 38-37-75. Seymour Harris of Bonnie Briar was next at 77, while Joe Germano of Bonnie Briar and Harry Meola of Orange County had 78, and Francis McCormick of Bethpage, Morty Howard of Fresh Meadow, Marvin Glauber of Ridgeway and James Tingley of Nassau had 79.

Galleta also paced his age group of 70-years-old-and-over with a net of 73-7-66. Ellis Schwartz of Quaker Ridge paced the 65-69 bracket with 80-15-65; Harris the 60-64 group with 77-12-65, and in the "baby's bracket" of 55-59, Adolph Sommer of Fairway and Matthias Juenger of Tamarac were low with a net of 67.
